ALC celebrates ETHNIC DAY



Ethnic Day is here to stay. This year's celebration, held on July 16, matched up to the high standards last year's event had set. On the massive stage of the Father Deviah Auditorium appeared, one after another, over 70 ALC students, girls as well as boys, parading their ethnic clothes and proclaiming their cultural identities in their native tongues. 'Culture for Unity' was the theme of this year's celebration.

'In celebrating Ethnic Day, we are celebrating the diversity within our unity,' said Fr Dr A Francis Xavier, Principal, welcoming the guests to the celebrations. It was followed by a brief talk by Dr G Sambasiva Rao, Head, Department of Telugu, on the significance of Ethnic Day. Fr A Stanley, Rector, declared open the one-hour-long display of ALC's cultural diversity. The opening ceremony was preceded by a procession by the scholastics of Sanjeevan Niwas and followed by a tribal dance by some of the Jesuit

In the pageant that followed in which there was a dazzling display of saris, sherwanis, ghaghras, lehngas, dhotis, and traditional clothes of Tibet, over 70 students of ALC belonging to about 25 different regions of this country appeared on the stage as Telugu girls, Kerala Christian brides, traditional Tamilians, Arabs, Adivasis and Lambadas, among others. The presentation was a contest as well (see box below) which was judged by a distinguished panel consisting of Fr A Stanley, Rector; Fr G Gnanadevan, Treasurer; Fr M Louie Doss, Director of New Hostel; and Ms N Nirmala Mary, Head of the Department of English.

In sharp contrast to the reverberations inside the auditorium, the lawns of Father Deviah Auditorium were quiet: at the 56 food stalls displaying 215 ethnic food items on the serene lawns, the gourmets and gourmands of ALC imperturbably themselves justice. Staff seminar explores issues in MENTORING AND RE-ACCREDITATION





The academic year started with a two-day (June 7-8) staff seminar which focused attention on mentoring and reaccreditation.

Mentoring was the subject of discussion on the first day of the seminar, and the discussion was facilitated by Fr Dr V Joseph Xavier, Superior and Coordinator of Research Unit, Indian Social Institute, Bengaluru. 'The Teacher as a professional' was the theme of a lively interaction Fr Xavier initiated. The participants identified and prioritized various characteristics of a good teacher which revolved around mentoring. The seminar also paid some attention to the process

of mentoring and the procedural aspects of mentoring.

On the second day, the subject of discussion was reaccreditation, and the resource person was Dr B S Ponmudiraj, Assistant Adviser, National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bengaluru. Responding to the

request from a participant to discuss the parameters NAAC assessment rather than providing information about the education system in India, the resource person focused attention on the subject with the utmost willingness. Thanks to his openness and his being receptive to suggestions and new ideas, a thorough discussion of NAAC parameters became possible, and Dr Ponmudiraj advised the participants to send their suggestions to NAAC through Fr Principal.

At the seminar, Dr Durga Prasad Ohja, Head, Postgraduate Department of Physics, was felicitated on receiving several awards, including the Indian Leadership Award for Educational Excellence (from the Indian Economic Development and Research Association) for which he had been selected.

ELT Centre hosts BEC WORKSHOP of the British Council

Twenty-five teachers of English from 14 colleges, including a university, participated in the Business English Certificate (BEC) Teacher Support Programme, a 3-day training programme of the British Council, meant for teachers of English who want to train students for the Cambridge University's international examination, BEC. The workshop was organized by the Loyola ELT Centre from October 6 to 8.

Explaining the significance of BEC, Dr CLN Prakash, Training Consultant, British Council, and the Course Trainer, who was the chief guest of the inaugural ceremony, said, 'BEC is offered at three levels - Preliminary, Vantage and Higher. These examinations are aimed primarily at individual learners who want to gain a business-related English language qualification; they also provide an ideal focus for courses in Business English. Though the tests are set in a business context, they do not test business knowledge; they only test the examinee's competence in the English language.'

'Examinations such as BEC demand mental and linguistic abilities of a



higher order,' said Dr P Ramanujam, Director, Loyola ELT Centre. 'They have, therefore, the potential to expand the mental and linguistic horizons of not only the students who are preparing for the examination but also the teachers who train them for it. A teacher training students for BEC can hope to gain a level of expertise which is far beyond what half-a-dozen teacher education programmes of the academic staff development system can effect.'

Both Fr A Stanley, Rector of ALC, who presided over the inauguration,

and Fr Dr A Francis Xavier, Principal of ALC, commended the efforts of the Loyola ELT Centre in enriching the English learning-teaching environment. Mr Ashish Goyal, Education Information Officer, British Library, Hyderabad, was also present at the workshop.

There were ten workshops sessions on the TSP focusing on all three levels of BEC and considering a range of activities to develop students' abilities in the skills and sub-skills tested on BEC. On the concluding day of the workshop, the participants undertook microteaching to put to test the techniques they had learned, and received feedback from their fellowparticipants, who acted as observers, as well as from the Course Trainer.

'The BEC workshop at ALC is one of my best TSPs,' said the Course Trainer. At the valedictory ceremony held on October 8, the Loyola ELT Centre was given a standing ovation by all the participants for organising a series of professional development programmes of great value.

A product of Andhra University from which he took his MA and PhD in Hindi, Dr Vallabha Rao is an active academic who has attended a number of national and international conferences and seminars, including the Eighth World Hindi Conference (2007) at New York, presented as well as published papers, taught Hindi at the postgraduate level at Ambedkar Open University, and guided research in Hindi at the MPhil level.

Dr Vallabha Rao is a well-known translator: he has translated 125 poems from Hindi into Telugu, 75 poems from Telugu into Hindi, several radio plays from Telugu into Hindi and radio features from Hindi into Telugu. He has presented over 50 lessons in Hindi on AIR, Vijayawada, and given radio talks, too.

A SURVEY OF THE BACKGROUND

of our first-year degree students

Can ALC boast of – or be accused of – elitism any longer? Do the students of this college continue to come from privileged backgrounds, as they used to in the past? Rule-of-thumb estimates have often suggested that while our elitism has considerably scaled down, we continue to be elite nevertheless, though not elitist. Fr Principal wanted to find out if this was true. He suggested a survey of the academic and financial backgrounds of our first-year degree students. Dr G Sahaya Baskaran, our Editor, conducted one. Here are the results in Dr Baskaran's own words.

Academic background

parameters here are: percentage of marks in the Intermediate Public Examination (IPE), medium of instruction at the intermediate level, and type of institution where intermediate education was pursued. On all three counts, the first-year degree students of ALC are by and large a privileged group.

First, percentage of marks. The vast majority of the students (89% of MPC and MPS, 83.5 % of the computer science sections, 86% of the biological science sections, 96.8% of the commerce sections, and 53% of the arts sections) obtained 60% or above in IPE. As a matter of fact, 16-22% of the science students secured 80% or above in IPE. The figures are low only in the case of the commerce (9.6%) and the arts (9%) sections.

Secondly, medium of instruction at the intermediate level. Here again, the students appear to be fairly well off. The vast majority of them studied through the medium of English: MPC and MPS 89%,

computer science sections 96%, biological science sections 76%, commerce sections 70%, and arts sections 64%. However, a good number of them did their SSC through the medium of Telugu.

Thirdly, the types of institutions were intermediate was done. A good number of them, if not the majority, studied in either corporate colleges or institutions like ALC: 35% of the science students in Chaitanya, 8% of them in Narayana, and 8% at ALC. The survey team did not find out how many of the other institutions were corporate colleges.

Financial background

Here, parental occupation is the only criterion adopted. The data indicate that 16-29% of our first-year students come from extremely poor financial backgrounds. To be precise, the parents of 29 % of the science students, 24% of the arts students, and 26.5% of the commerce students are daily-wage labourers eking out a living working as rickshaw pullers or coolies (the latter expression is considered to be offensive). The commerce sections

record the highest number (33%) of this category, followed by MPC and MPS (30%), biological sciences (14%), and computer science sections (5.3%). The agricultural background accounts for 27% in the case of commerce, 25% in the case of arts, and 22% in the case of science. The parents of the remaining students do various other jobs – as bankers, lawyers, teachers, businessm(wom)en, government employees, mechanics, etc.

Where do we go from here?

The survey not only confirms that our elitism has substantially scaled down but also shows that about onefourth of our first-year students are from extremely poor financial backgrounds. The college management has introduced the following schemes to alleviate their hardship: (a) The mid-day meal scheme under which 160 students are provided subsidized (Rs 7 per meal) lunch which costs the management Rs 14 per meal; (b) The earn-while-you-learn scheme under which 180 students, including

a few intermediate ones, are supported; (c) a good number of poor students are provided management scholarships. All three schemes cost Rs 9 lakhs per year which includes the interest accrued from the established scholarships (Rs 64,000/-).

'The arrangements the management has made are good, but they are not enough, given the number of students who need support,' says Fr Dr A Francis Xavier, Principal. 'According to a rough estimate, Rs 20 lakhs will have to be raised every year to help all these students. I would, therefore, appeal to people who are philanthropically inclined to support us in our task of providing succour to these miserable students. I am grateful to one of our lecturers who wishes to remain anonymous for his generous gesture. He has recently donated Rs 25,000 for establishing a scholarship in the name Dr YSR for a BSc (MPC) student every year.'

Processing well-worn hand-me-downs

Over a quarter century ago, while "mining" for books on writing in Father Gordon Library, I came across a treasure called A Short Guide to English Style by Alan Warner, which made me cry like Archimedes. (Incidentally, I have uttered several eurekas in Father Gordon Library, which is a veritable goldmine with, alas, few miners.) I have since read the Warner book over a dozen times and recommended it to several batches of students who have never surprised me by sharing my passion for mining.

But that's another story. What is of relevance here is Warner's advice to writers in three of the chapters of the book: 'Cut the cackle and come to the 'osses'; 'Call a spade a spade'; 'Hit the nail on the head.' In other words, Warner tells writers to avoid ready-made expressions which can be indiscriminately applied to many similar objects or situations. To the cliché-expert, every big city is a "bustling metropolis", every mountain a "majestic mountain", and every campus a "sprawling campus". Don't say something is interesting, says Warner; make it interesting by the way you describe it.

Why am I waxing lyrical on Warner? It's because the reports we receive for Loyola Today (LT) prove that A Short Guide, written over six decades ago, is still relevant. The reports for the current issue, for instance, abound in hand-me-downs with little attempt to tell us what actually happened. Here is a sample: events were organised "successfully"; celebrations were "grand"; speakers spoke "enthusiastically"; Event X "executed the best approach and made people understand and aware of..." Take away these general statements, and there will be nothing in the reports except names. The reports might as well say, 'You know how — was held last year. It was held the same way this year also.'

At LT, we have quite a job collecting up and processing these well-worn hand-me-downs.

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
