To enhance active learning, develop students' educational and career planning skills, and build community support, the college focuses on a multidisciplinary integrated curriculum. To encompass academic rigor, technical expertise, applied learning, active exploration, and assessment practices, the college offers a range of multidisciplinary programs, including: B.Sc. Programs in 1. Mathematics, Physics, and Chemistry; 2. Mathematics, Physics, and Computer Science; 3. Mathematics, Electronics, and Computer Science; 4. Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Science; 5. Mathematics, Physics, and Statistics; 6. Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry; 7. Microbiology, Biotechnology, and Chemistry; 8. Microbiology, Food Technology, and Chemistry. B.A. programs in 1. History, Political Science, and Economics; 2. History, Political Science, and Advanced English; 3. Mathematics, Statistics, and Economics. Interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approaches in arts and sciences foster a deeper understanding of complex issues by integrating knowledge from multiple disciplines. Interdisciplinary studies blend concepts, theories, and methods from different fields to create new perspectives and solutions, encouraging innovation and critical thinking. For instance, the intersection of biology and digital art has led to advancements in medical visualization, while the combination of physics and music has enhanced acoustic engineering. On the other hand, multidisciplinary approaches maintain the distinct boundaries of individual disciplines while promoting collaboration to address common challenges, such as climate change or healthcare. Both approaches enrich learning, broaden perspectives, and contribute to holistic problem-solving, preparing individuals to navigate an increasingly interconnected world. Learning is an active process that enables learners to think, interpret, analyse, and evaluate. Interdisciplinary courses contribute to a better understanding of problems and phenomena. To foster intellectual skills, creative thinking, and multiple perspectives, the College emphasizes interdisciplinary courses such as 1. B.Sc. in Electronics Technology, 2. B.Sc. in Visual Communication, 3. B.Com. in General and Computer Science, 4. BBA

(General), BBA (Aviation Management), BBA (Logistics), 5. B.Sc. Hotel Management and Hospital Administration The short term and Semester Multidisciplinary Internships focus on developing a deeper understanding, critical thinking, and collaboration skills. These Internships help students tackle real-world issues and challenges through proper review, and representation. In the fields of science, arts, humanities or commerce, students explore the interactions between different domains and means of expression. Andhra Loyola College fosters a strong sense of service orientation and social responsibility among students through various community service initiatives. As part of their first-year undergraduate studies, each student dedicates 50 hours to supporting and empowering rural communities by identifying and enhancing their entrepreneurial skills through the Andhra Loyola Extension Service for Rural Transformation (ALERT) program. Additionally, the Andhra Loyola Assistance for Neighbourhood Advancement (ALANA) initiative focuses on educating and inspiring students from local schools, helping them develop essential communication, soft, technical, and analytical skills. The college also houses the CCLR Innovation Council, a dedicated research cell that offers students from the Departments of Physics and Chemistry numerous opportunities to engage in research and explore their areas of interest. Furthermore, the institute organizes various multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary workshops and conferences to encourage student engagement across different disciplines, facilitating the exchange of ideas and knowledge.

Andhra Loyola College, aligning with the NEP guidelines, has implemented the Academic Bank of Credits to empower students with a more learner-centric approach. Key Features of ABC at Andhra Loyola College: Credit Accumulation and Transfer: Students can accumulate credits for courses completed at Andhra Loyola College and other institutions registered with the ABC framework. These credits are stored digitally in a secure ABC account, allowing seamless transfer between institutions. Interdisciplinary Learning: ABC enables students to pursue courses across disciplines and institutions, encouraging holistic and multidisciplinary education. Flexibility in Education: Students can take breaks in their education without losing earned credits, facilitating re-entry into academic programs. Recognition of Prior Learning: Credits earned from MOOCs, online courses, or approved skill-development programs can also be added to the ABC account. Student Empowerment: The ABC

promotes lifelong learning by allowing students to earn and redeem credits for up to 7 years, catering to diverse academic and career goals. Collaboration with Stakeholders: Andhra Loyola College actively collaborates with the National e-Governance Division (NeGD) and UGC to ensure smooth integration and functionality of the ABC framework. Benefits for Students at Andhra Loyola College: Increased flexibility in designing personalized academic pathways. Opportunity to explore courses from multiple institutions without the constraints of rigid curricula. Enhanced career readiness through exposure to diverse learning experiences. By embracing the Academic Bank of Credits, Andhra Loyola College reaffirms its commitment to providing quality education tailored to the needs of modern learners while upholding its mission of academic excellence and holistic development. A committee was established, with the Controller of Examinations serving as the convener. The committee includes Vice Principals, Deans, and few other senior staff members as its members. Their primary focus is on deliberating the implementation of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). Concurrently, awareness programs for both students and staff regarding the utilization of the ABC portal are currently underway.

The Language Lab, ELT (English Language Teaching) Centre, and Computer Labs play a pivotal role in enhancing students' capabilities. The Visual Communication Lab provides students with the skills and knowledge needed to navigate the visually driven communication landscape, fostering creativity, digital literacy, and critical thinking, which are valuable in both educational and professional contexts. The Electronics Department offers hands-on experience, teaching students safety protocols, fostering creativity, and preparing them for careers in electronics and related fields. Similarly, the Biotechnology Department equips students with laboratory techniques, data analysis skills, and a strong ethical foundation, enabling them to address critical challenges in healthcare, agriculture, and environmental sustainability. The Food Technology Department provides students with essential competencies in food processing, preservation, and safety, preparing them for

careers in the food industry. The college employs an internal ERP solution for teaching, learning, evaluation, and administrative processes. A notable advantage of the system is its integration of digital resources, which allows users to directly access a wide array of digital content through the OPAC, thereby enhancing the library's services and developing digital literacy. The automation of routine tasks has allowed library staff to reallocate their time toward more personalized services, such as research assistance and information literacy support.

A key advantage of NewGenLib is its ability to integrate metadata records with digital attachments, enhancing the richness of the online public access catalogue (OPAC). Users can easily search for and access digital resources directly through the OPAC interface, facilitating seamless discovery and retrieval of information.

Moreover, NewGenLib is compatible with applications that support the development of Digital Libraries, further expanding its utility and versatility.

Andhra Loyola College prioritizes waste management to maintain

cleanliness, promote sustainability, and create a healthy environment. The campus strives to be a zero-waste zone, guided by the "Reduce, Recover, Recycle, and Reuse" policy. A strict noplastic policy prohibits single-use plastics, and biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste is segregated using color-coded bins.

Partnerships with TES AMM and Suraj Krishna Greenaries ensure proper recycling of e-waste and dry waste. The college emphasizes source segregation of waste by providing separate bins for recyclables, non-recyclables, organic, and hazardous materials. Leaf litter decomposes on-site to enrich soil, and sanitary waste is disposed of via incinerators. Effluents from laboratories and washrooms are managed through underground tanks and septic systems.

Awareness programs, workshops, and campaigns educate students and staff about waste management, recycling, and composting. Cleanliness drives, like Swacch Loyola, further instill environmental consciousness. The administrative office minimizes paper use through digitization, and recyclable materials are handed over to authorized agencies. Unusable e-waste is periodically sold to specialized dealers for safe recycling. These efforts ensure a sustainable and eco-friendly campus.

The automation of routine tasks has allowed library staff to reallocate their time toward more personalized services, such as research assistance and information literacy

support.

A key advantage of NewGenLib is its ability to integrate metadata records with digital attachments, enhancing the richness of the online public access catalogue (OPAC). Users can easily search for and access digital resources directly through the OPAC interface, facilitating seamless discovery and retrieval of information. Andhra Loyola College Waste Management

Andhra Loyola College prioritizes waste management to maintain cleanliness, promote sustainability, and create a healthy environment. The campus strives to be a zero-waste zone, guided by the "Reduce, Recover, Recycle, and Reuse" policy. A strict no-plastic policy prohibits single-use plastics, and biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste is segregated using color-coded bins.

Partnerships with TES AMM and Suraj Krishna Greenaries ensure proper recycling of e-waste and dry waste. The college emphasizes source segregation of waste by providing separate bins for recyclables, non-recyclables, organic, and hazardous materials. Leaf litter decomposes on-site to enrich soil, and sanitary waste is disposed of via incinerators. Effluents from laboratories and washrooms are managed through underground tanks and septic systems.

Awareness programs, workshops, and campaigns educate students and staff about waste management, recycling, and composting. Cleanliness drives, like Swacch Loyola, further instill environmental consciousness. The administrative office minimizes paper use through digitization, and recyclable materials are handed over to authorized agencies. Unusable e-waste is periodically sold to specialized dealers for safe recycling. These efforts ensure a sustainable and eco-friendly campus.
