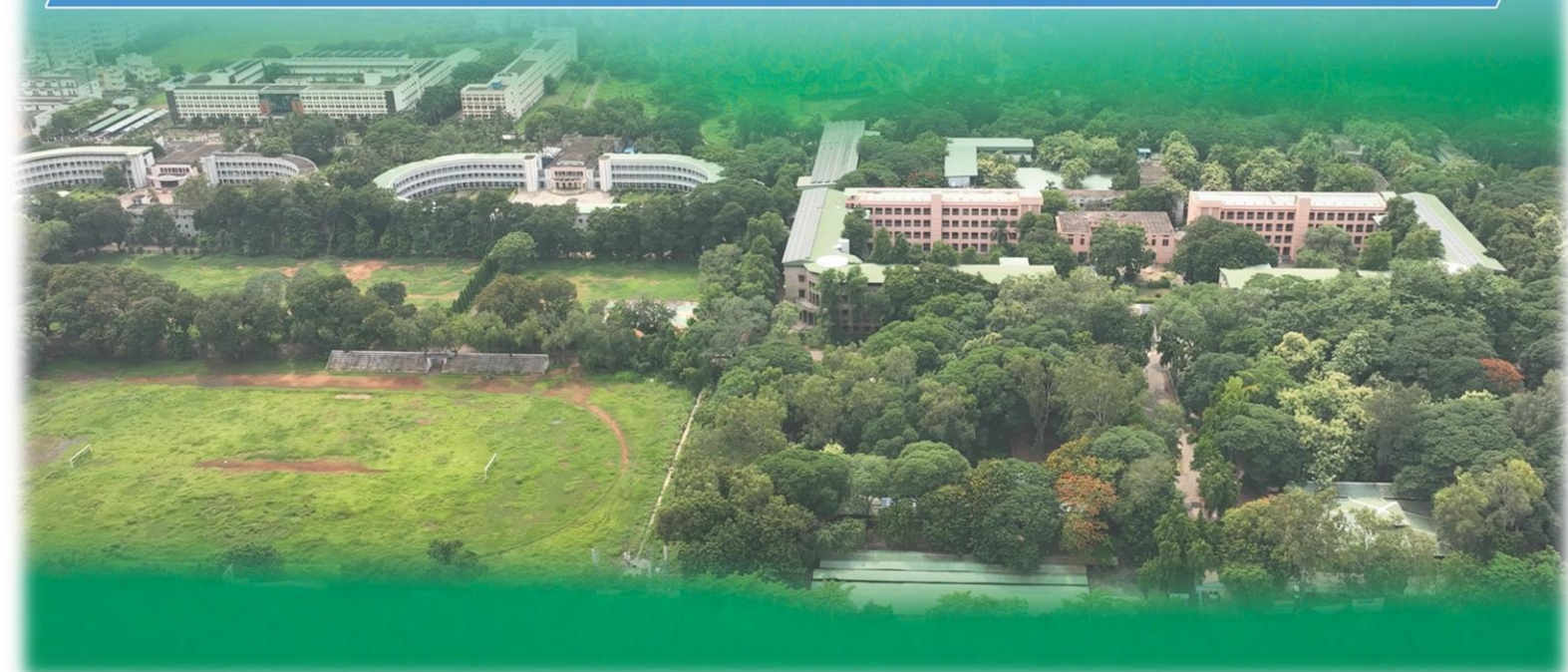

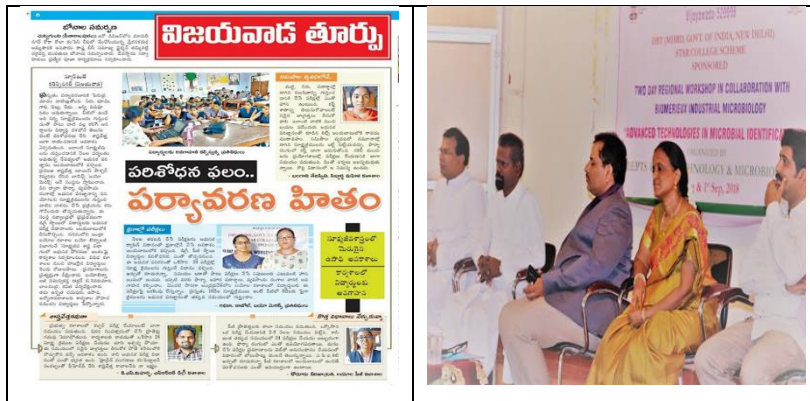
7. The Department of Arts in collaboration with Indian Social Institutes, Bengaluru and New Delhi, organized a two-Day National Seminar on “Contributions of Minorities to Nation Building” on 3rd and 4th January 2019. The inaugural session of the Seminar began with Rev Fr.Dr.G.A.P. Kishore, SJ, Principal, ALC, welcoming the Dignitaries and Participants of the Seminar. Chief Guest Most Rev. Dr. Joseph Raja Rao Thelagathoti, Bishop of Vijayawada, delivered the Inaugural Address. Rev.Fr.Dr. Selvaraj Arulnathan SJ, Director, ISI, Bengaluru, presented the Seminar Theme to the Participants. Sri Irfan Engineer, Chairman, Centre for Study of Society and Secularism, Mumbai, delivered the Keynote Address. The inaugural session was followed by technical sessions spread over the two days of Seminar in which 56 eminent personalities from different parts of the Country participated.
